School Participatory Budgeting (SPB) is an innovative civic learning process that engages and empowers students to contribute to their communities and civic life.

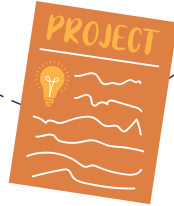

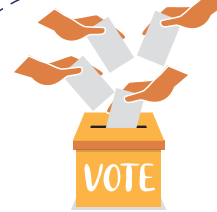

How it Works

Through SPB, students “learn democracy by doing” through a process of generating ideas, developing proposals, campaigning and deliberating, and voting to fund improvement projects that build stronger school communities. CFA provides training and support to our school partners to implement a year-long process, led by students working alongside their educators and the community.
